Kevin James – Talk Show Host on KRLA (870), Attorney, and candidate for Mayor of Los Angeles.

By way of brief background, Mr James has been an attorney in Los Angeles since 1988 when he began his legal career with Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher. After Gibson Dunn, he spent more than 3 years as an Assistant U.S. Attorney in Los Angeles. He has practiced entertainment litigation since late 1993 and continue that practice today at Lavelly & Singer in Century City.

In addition to his law practice, he has been a radio broadcaster in Los Angeles since January 2003 -- first with KABC and currently with KRLA (where he has been since May 2007). He has been covering local Los Angeles issues since I began his radio career in 2003.

Kevin James also has experience working with non-profits in Los Angeles, having served on the Board of AIDS Project Los Angeles for 6 years, including 2 years as Co-Chair.
